25 Years of Shelter and What's Next

Over the past 25 years, we have grown so much!

We started serving houseless folks in 1998 as a migrating winter shelter, moving from place to place. Our services were desperately needed, and in 2003, we opened our beloved Torres Community Shelter. Tim Torres, our founding director, was a passionate advocate for people experiencing homelessness, and had experienced homelessness himself. Though he sadly passed away in 2001, his legacy lives on today in everything that we do to help people in need!

As our community grew and changed, so did we. We expanded our services and began housing adults, seniors, and families with children. We created a robust case management program, which provides one-on-one assistance to everyone we serve. To make an even greater impact in our community, we expanded our shelter bed capacity to 177 and moved from a nightly shelter to keeping our doors open 24/7.

I continue to be amazed and so grateful for our dedicated staff. We have stuck by our mission and have provided compassionate, life-saving services to some of the most vulnerable people in need in our community—and we have done that through recessions, the pandemic and several major disasters.
